What is a manifesto?

Manifesto: a public declaration of policy and aims, especially one issued before an election by a political party or candidate.

Your manifesto should highlight the key changes and impact you would like to make if you are elected. Think of it as a statement to support your candidacy.

Think about your motivations for running in the elections, and the key things you would like to achieve.

It is a good idea to think about what our current students needs and desires are, as they will be electing you to represent them. Are there any national, local or Solent issues that you would like to work on?





What is your motivation?

Before you start writing your manifesto, it is important to first think about why you want to take on this role, and what impact you can have to improve the student experience for current and future students at Solent University.

- What is important to you?
- What is important to other students?
- What are the current issues impacting on students experience at Solent University?
- What are practical things that you can do to make a change?
- You might want to go out and speak to current students to find out what is important to them.





Writing Tips

Try to keep your manifesto to around 100 words! Think about how much students are likely to read.

Choose the 3/4 key motivators for becoming an officer to decide your key manifesto points.

These need to be realistic, relevant and achievable!

- What skills do you have that would be useful?
- Have you been an Officer for the SU before? What did you achieve?

Conclusion:

• Thank students for reading and summarise why they should vote for you.

Don't forget to add a photo of yourself to your manifesto!





Manifesto Top Tips

- Make sure that what you include in your manifesto is relevant, achievable and doesn't break the law or any student code of conducts.
- Take a look at campaigns and issues the SU is currently working on, can you advance these in post?
- Look at current policies, is there anything that is'nt working?
- Talk to students! Find out what is important to them and want they want our of their officers.
- Think about how you are going to appeal to the wider student body.
- Remember, your manifesto is important, but how will you get your message out to the wider student body?
- If you are going to be using social media to support your campaign, add the link in!
