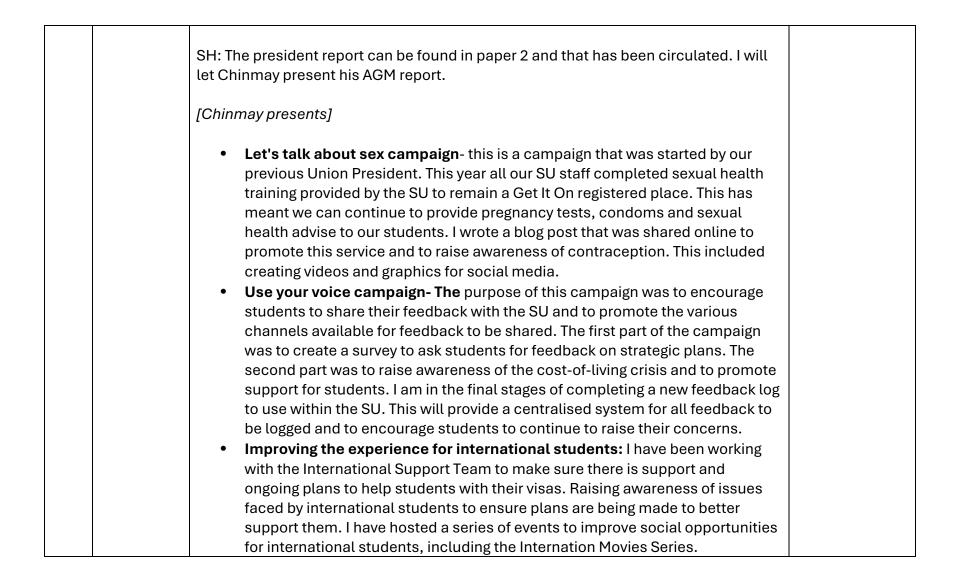

	Elections 2025 had a huge increase in engagement, 854 students took part in
	voting, an increase of 87%. 3203 individual votes were cast, an increase of
	76%. Highest voter turnout since 2019!!

<ul> <li>A total of 12 Sabbatical Candidates took part in Elections, last year there were 4 candidates.</li> </ul>
• A total of 267 Course Reps for this academic year, 186 (70%) of Course Reps have completed training.
Highest Student Council attendance on record, 38 students attended a meeting.
<ul> <li>Supported over 120 students so far this year with advice cases, compared to the whole of the previous academic year with 137 cases.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>47 active societies compared to 23 last academic year. With 498 members – the number of members increased by 69 students compared to last year. Sonar Events being the biggest with 89 members (increase of 15), Solent Video Games with 59 members and Law Society with 57 members.</li> </ul>
• Since September 2024, the SU Exchange has been visited 2955 times, 361 registered members (141 more than last year), and has distributed 12645 items (3,843 items last year).

SS has attended over 20 course committee meetings. Introduced new initiatives to promote engagement, including Course Rep of the Month and monthly catch-up meetings.</li> <li>Peer Assisted Learning Scheme: Currently developing a proposal. Has completed research on how it is implemented at other universities.</li> <li>AI Policy Advocacy: Working with the Head of Education and Head Librarian to establish a clear AI policy and guidelines for students.</li> <li>Student Social Space will be presented later by SH, as he is jointly working on</li> </ul>

	Introduce Wellness Sessions: I have written a few blog posts to promote
	wellbeing for students and the current services available at the University.
	Following feedback from students it was important to work with the University
	to improve the counselling service. As a result, the application process to
	access the mental health team has been improved, and there are less
	documents to complete.
	Expanding the Multifaith rooms: There has already been an additional room
	added, so I did not push the University to add another space so quickly.
	Instead, I worked with the Faith Societies gathering their feedback and
	supporting them to be able to carry out their activities and practice. Meeting
	regularly and advocating for their needs.
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	to access funding from the Government but our International students are
	not. So i have been carrying out research and drafting a new policy to enable
	the University/ SU to provide funds to support international students. This can
	then be distributed to students in hardship.
	Student Social Space: I have been working collaboratively with Sanidhya
	Shetty to gather feedback from students to find out if they would like a student
	social space. We have created a survey that closes on the 30th of April.
	Go with the Flow Campaign: A motion was raised at student council to
	provide more sanitary products and to be inclusive of disabled toilets. I have
	updated the card in the toilets to include a QR code for students to share
	feedback on the campaign. I have also secured a donation from Boots of



		<ul> <li>sanitary products. This allowed us to provide sanitary products in 20 toilets including disabled ones. I also presented that we allocated SU funding to be able to continue to run this campaign in the future. This has been approved. 2	Chinmay Darji	Audited Accounts         CD: The audited accounts for 2023/24 can be found in paper 5 and that has been circulated. I will present an overview of the accounts for you to ask questions on if you wish.         [CD Presents]         • Solent Students' Union presents its audited financial statements for the year August 2023 to July 2024. The accounts consolidate the charity, Solent



Students' Union, and the trading company, Solent Students' Union Trading Limited.	
<ul> <li>Although there is no statutory requirement at present to conduct an audit due</li> </ul>	
to the charity's income being well below the audit threshold (£1m), the charity	
has its financial statements and practices externally audited on an annual	
basis to satisfy the University and also the charity's trustees. The trading	
company is not audited, although the intercompany balances between the	
charity and trading company are examined by the auditors.	
<ul> <li>The audit, which took place on site in September 2024, was undertaken by</li> </ul>	
Godfrey Wilson.	
<ul> <li>The resulting financial statements were signed off by the Board of Trustees in</li> </ul>	
November 2024.	
<ul> <li>The charity received an unqualified audit report, meaning the auditors</li> </ul>	
consider the financial statements provide a true and fair view of the charity's	
finances.	
<ul> <li>The financial statements recognise a deficit of £37,438 during the year,</li> </ul>	
compared to a deficit of £67,271 in the prior year.	
<ul> <li>At the end of the year, the general fund level (funds which can be used in</li> </ul>	
future years and are not restricted in how they can be spent) was £123,221,	
down from £182,033 in the prior year.	
<ul> <li>However, if you add back the SUSS pension deficit liability, the free reserves</li> </ul>	
level was £475,465, down from £553,224 in the prior year.	
<ul> <li>SUSS is a liability on the Union's balance sheet of £352,244 (£371,191 in the</li> </ul>	
prior year). SUSS is a defined benefit pension scheme whose membership	
consists of employees of students' unions throughout the UK. The scheme is	
in deficit and the Union makes monthly contributions, increasing at 5% per	



		<ul> <li>annum. At present, the University provides additional funding to cover these deficit contributions.</li> <li>Does anyone have any questions about the Audited Accounts before we move onto voting? <ul> <li>AL asks to move back to the financial expenditure overview so that she can review again. After a few minutes, AL confirms that she does not have any questions.</li> <li>LG states that she will abstain as she does not feel she knows enough to give a valid response.</li> <li>A consensus is shared that they do not know enough about finance to decide on how to vote, so the majority decide to abstain.</li> </ul> </li> <li>CD: We will move to vote on the report: <ul> <li>Can all those who vote to approve the report please raise their hand: 1 vote</li> <li>Can all those who vote to reject please raise their hand:0</li> </ul> </li> <li>CD: As a result, the vote is to abstain.</li> </ul>

		afterwards, if they have been passed. Motion1- Safeguarding and Accountability System CD: The motion called "Safeguarding and Accountability System" can be found in paper 8 and that has been circulated. I will now pass over to Lou to present their motion.	
		<ul> <li>LG presents Motion 1:</li> <li>This motion has been raised due to issues within the Theatre Course around harassment and bullying. When issues were discussed in the course committee meeting, it was highlighted that the follow up process was not working. So, Jon Grace created a new system that allows students to raise concerns anonymously. There needs to be a simpler form for students to complete instead of one that takes over five minutes. If this system goes ahead, we should incorporate it into Course Rep training, they can then help</li> </ul>	



	<ul> <li>to spread awareness. Ultimately, we want to ensure there is an accessible way to speak up about bullying and for it to be dealt with without bias.</li> <li>LG shows the attendees the draft version of the form</li> <li>Does anyone have any questions about Motion 1 before we move onto voting?</li> <li>AL: What would the system look like:</li> <li>LG: Shares the example system created by JG with the attendees.</li> <li>AG: Notes that there is a section that asks for student's name.
