Role Description



Housing Officer

Overview:

Act as the primary student representative of all students at Solent University on all housing and accommodation issues (e.g. Halls and Private Rented) issues within the university, Students' Union and wider community. To ensure that the voices of all students are heard and that the right support is available at Solent University.

Responsibilities:

- Represent all students on Student Council and in the Students' Union
- Be the primary student spokesperson on accommodation issues
- Raise awareness around of accommodation issues affecting students
- Lead campaigns for positive change for the student accommodation

Training & Support:

Training will be provided to all Student Officers upon election and each officer will be paired with a full time Sabbatical Officer to act as a mentor. Ongoing support will be available from the Students' Union Representation Department throughout the year.

Time Commitment:

As the position is voluntary it's time commitment can be flexible to fit in with a student's studies. It's recommended that students commit around **4 hours per week** to the role. Student Council Meetings typically occur every 4 weeks during term time and there are normally around 5 per year.
